

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF THE
SOCIETY FOR RISK ANALYSIS

We, the undersigned, all of whom are of full age and citizens of the United States, acting as incorporators of a corporation for benevolent, charitable, educational and scientific purposes, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation pursuant to the District of Columbia Non-Profit Corporation Act:

FIRST: The name by which this Corporation shall be known in law is:

SOCIETY FOR RISK ANALYSIS

SECOND: The period of duration for which it is organized is perpetual.

THIRD: The business and purposes for which the Corporation is organized are:

promote the acquisition and utilization of knowledge in risk analysis and facilitate the exchange of information among its members as well as other interested professionals;

foster and promote knowledge and understanding of risk analysis techniques and their applications;

communicate and interact among individuals engaged in risk analysis;

apply risk analysis techniques to assess the hazards and risks to which individuals and populations are exposed;

disseminate risk analysis information and concepts to all interested individuals;

advance the state-of-the-art in all aspects of risk analysis;

integrate and interact with the various disciplines involved in risk analysis;

collect, receive and maintain a fund or funds by subscription or otherwise and apply the income and principal thereof to the promotion of the purposes hereinabove set out and use as means to these ends research, publication, the employment of experts and the establishment and maintenance of bureaus, committees, offices and agencies and other means which, from time to time, shall be deemed advisable and expedient;

take, hold by bequest, devise, gift, purchase or lease, either absolutely or in trust, for any of its purposes, any property, real, personal or mixed, without limitation as to amount of value; convey, mortgage or pledge such property; invest and reinvest any principal, and deal with and expend the income and principal of said Corporation in such manner as will promote its purposes.

FOURTH: The Corporation shall have members.

FIFTH: The Corporation is to be divided into three (3) classes of members. ACTIVE Members are qualified persons who have a continuing professional interest in risk analysis or are engaged in some phase of development or

application of risk analysis. HONORARY Members are distinguished contributors to the advancement of knowledge in risk analysis. STUDENT Members are full time students engaged in studies leading to a degree in a discipline in which risk analysis is a distinct element.

SIXTH: Councilors shall be elected by the Membership of the Corporation for three-year terms, three to be elected each year. Nominations for office shall be made by a Nominating Committee.

SEVENTH: There shall be a Council responsible for the fulfillment of the scientific and business obligations of the Corporation. Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Council shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all the assets of the Corporation exclusively for the purposes of the Corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future U.S. Internal Revenue Law), as the Council shall determine.

Eighth: No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its Members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article III hereof. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, this Corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of this Corporation.

NINTH: The address, including street and number, of its initial registered office is 2540 Massachusetts Avenue, NW, Washington, DC, and the name of its registered agent at such address is Alexander Hollaender.

TENTH: The number of Trustees, Directors or Managers of the Corporation shall be fourteen, consisting of a Council of which the members shall be four Officers of the Corporation, the immediate past-president and nine Councilors.
