
Suggested update:

In addition to the five officers, additional persons may be appointed by the Chair as an Advisor to the ARMSG Executive Committee.

Rationale

- Bi-monthly zoom meetings and sharing the workload in-between the people in the group has proven to be a success
- Additional advisor(s) → more work can be done
- For some work tasks we may need special competence
- Enables continuity (for example young members)
- Since we are the applied group, it is good to have people from many industries represented
- We should trust that the chair will appoint a 'reasonable' number of advisors



- She has demonstrated the Accimap framework, traditionally used for accident investigations, can be used for risk analysis in an applied setting to evaluate insider threats.






