AUGUST 1-3: SRA 1983 ANNUAL CONFERENCE AND BUSINESS MEETING IN NEW YORK CITY

The 1983 Annual Conference and Business Meeting of the Society for Risk Analysis will be held August 1-3 at the Grand Hyatt Hotel in New York City. Using the theme "Risk Analysis in the Private Sector," the conference will feature plenary sessions on Monday and Wednesday mornings, concurrent technical sessions on Monday and Wednesday afternoons and all day Tuesday, and a business meeting and reception on Monday evening. About 60 papers are scheduled for the technical sessions.

SRA'S 1983-84 ELECTIONS IN PROGRESS

HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL RISK ANALYSIS SUBJECT OF NATIONAL CAPITAL AREA CHAPTER WORKSHOP

The National Capital Area Chapter of SRA sponsored a Workshop on the Methodology of Health and Environmental Risk Analysis on March 25 in Washington, D.C. Topics covered included (1) air, water, and food chain modeling, (2) cancer assessment, (3) human health threshold effects, (4) ecological effects assessment, (5) probabilistic risk, and (6) risk perception. Evaluation forms filled out by the approximately 30 workshop participants indicated overwhelming approval of the workshop in terms of concept and conduct.

EAST TENNESSEE CHAPTER ELECTS OFFICERS, HOLDS INAUGURAL MEETING

The newly formed East Tennessee Chapter of SRA announced its first roster of elected off-icers in January, conducted the first monthly meeting of its executive committee on February 4, and held its inaugural meeting for the entire membership on April 20.

The inaugural meeting of the chapter, attended by 40 persons, was hosted by Technology for Energy Corporation in Knoxville, TN, with James E. BROOKINGS INSTITUTION AND NSF SPONSOR US-FRG CONFERENCE

A joint United States and Federal Republic of Germany Conference on Risk Management was hosted by the Brookings Institution and the National Science Foundation Risk Analysis Program at NSF April 25-29. The objective of the conference was to bring together researchers from the two countries to exchange information, clarify ideas, and enhance the progress of risk analysis research in both countries. The conference was attended by 20 US and 17 FRG risk analysis experts. The conference organizer was Dr. Lester Lave of Carnegie Mellon University.

During the four days of the conference the participants divided into four application groups and four methods groups. The applications groups were: food and drug regulation; asbestos; transport of hazardous materials; and low probability/high consequence chemical installation accidents. The methods groups were: risk assessment; public perception; government control methods; and nonregulatory control methods.
